Council Officers Elections

The council is in the preparation of electing new council officers for the next Fraternal Year (2024-2025).

At the May 14th Regular Membership Meeting, the Nominating Committee will present the Slate of Candidates for the elective council offices.

At the June 11th Regular Membership Meeting, Elections will be held. Other nominations can be made from the floor. Nominations will not be closed until the election meeting has convened and the members are ready to vote.

On July 1st, the new Fraternal Year (2024-2025) begins with the new elected council officers.

Third Degree Council Elected Officers Duties and Responsibilities

Grand Knight (GK) - is the chief executive officer of the council. He is responsible for setting council goals and ensuring that all officers fulfill their duties in reaching these objectives. He presides over all meetings; appoints program and committee directors as needed and fills officer roles in the event of vacancies; countersigns checks and orders for payment; and is responsible for the council's First Degree Team. Ideally, the GK should be a junior so that as a senior he can serve as a mentor for the next GK.

Deputy Grand Knight (DGK) - serves as the GK's right-hand man and should fill in for the GK when he is not present. Additionally, the DGK will likely lead a committee, or multiple committees, if he chooses to do so. Some DGKs serve as their council's **Program Director**. Ultimately, he assists the GK in leading the council and reaching council objectives. In some councils, the DGK role might be used to groom a possible GK candidate for the following year. Finally, the DGK may serve as a liaison between the council and other groups that share similar interest.

Chancellor - assists both the GK and DGK in the leading of the council by engaging and strengthening the council's members. His primary responsibilities include both recruiting and retaining members and to this end he should set up different events that display the different values and principles of the Knights of Columbus. The Chancellor should participate in the council's degree team and should serve on both the Admission and Retention Committees.

Treasurer - is responsible for managing the council funds, whether in bank or school accounts. He receives money from the Financial Secretary and deposits funds into council accounts. He is also responsible for paying all council expenses. Finally, he balances and verifies the ledger and keeps the updated budget once approved by the council.

Duties and Responsibilities (cont.)

Advocate - acts as council parliamentarian; he should be knowledgeable in Robert's Rules of Order and *Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting* (#1937). He may seek legal assistance from the state advocate, should issues arise. The advocate should be able to take on additional responsibilities as the council deems necessary.

Recorder - has the responsibility of recording all meetings and events held by the council. He should record minutes, conversations, and other information helpful to the council and prepare them to be distributed to the council membership in a timely manner. Additionally, he should help with council event notifications, council meeting reminders, and assist with council social media responsibilities.

Warden - is responsible for the property owned by the council. He is also in charge of setting up meetings and leads both the Inside and Outside guards. Many college councils utilize the warden and guards as custodians of the campus ministry property which may include raking leaves, shoveling snow, and assisting with maintenance of the interior.

Inside/Outside Guards - carry out tasks given to them by the GK and follow orders of the Warden. They are responsible for checking membership cards and allowing entrance to meetings. Councils should consider appointing additional inside and outside guards, especially among promising freshmen, as this provides early leadership opportunities from which they can be elected to higher positions as they enter their sophomore year.

Trustees (3-Year | 2-Year | 1-Year) - advise the GK, supervise the council's financial matters, and conduct the semiannual audits. Usually the immediate Past Grand Knight will serve as a Trustee.

Why Be A Knight?





Lee and Tom are very appreciative of the Knights stepping up to deliver firewood to help them keep warm through the waning days of winter's grip.





Fourth Degree Assembly Officers Duties and Responsibilities

FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR - Similar to Grand Knight, is the chief executive officer of the assembly and acts as the Presiding Officer, with all the powers and duties incident to such office. He appoints committees, countersigns orders and checks. He serves as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and is an ex-officio member of all committees. He is responsible for establishing a Color Corps and annually appoints or reappoints the Assembly Color Corps Commander. He may perform such other duties as the Supreme Assembly may impose.

FAITHFUL FRIAR - Similar to Chaplain, is the Spiritual Advisor of the Assembly. He is expected to make a report at Assembly Meetings on religious matters. The Faithful Navigator, Captain, Admiral, and Pilot appoint a Priest annually in accordance with such rules established by the Bishop of the Diocese to serve the Assembly.

FAITHFUL CAPTAIN - Similar to DGK, shall, in the absence of the Faithful Navigator, perform the duties and exercise the powers of that office. He shall also, to ensure good attendance at meetings and other functions, have charge of social and other activities under the Good of the Order.

FAITHFUL PILOT - The Faithful Pilot, similar to Warden, shall have charge of all properties of the Assembly except monies, accounts, and record books of the officers, but including ceremonials. He shall be responsible for the arrangement of the Assembly Chamber and shall direct and be responsible for the activities of the Sentinels.

FAITHFUL COMPTROLLER - Similar to FS, shall keep a roll and the records of the members with the date of their initiation in the Fourth Degree. He shall collect and receive all monies due to the Assembly and all funds obtained from any source and transfer the same to the Faithful Purser and obtain a receipt from him.

Duties and Responsibilities (cont.)

FAITHFUL COMPTROLLER - (cont.) Similar to FS, shall keep a roll and the records of the members with the date of their initiation in the Fourth Degree. He shall collect and receive all monies due to the Assembly and all funds obtained from any source and transfer the same to the Faithful Purser and obtain a receipt from him.

FAITHFUL SCRIBE - Similar to Recorder, shall keep a record of the minutes of all regular and special meetings in a bound book furnished for that purpose by the Assembly.

FAITHFUL PURSER - Similar to Treasurer, is the custodian of all funds obtained from any source. He makes deposits and keeps records, pays all orders drawn on him by the Faithful Comptroller and Faithful Navigator and makes records available to the Board of Trustees as required.

FAITHFUL INNER & OUTER SENTINELS - Similar to Inside and Outside Guards, shall be responsible to see that all in attendance at meetings are in possession of appropriate valid 3rd and 4th Degree membership cards and shall perform such other duties as directed by the Faithful Pilot.

FAITHFUL ADMIRAL - The immediate Past Faithful Navigator, is appointed annually by the Faithful Navigator and shall preside in case of the absence of both the Faithful Navigator and Faithful Pilot. He may also perform other duties as assigned him by the Faithful Navigator. In the absence of the Faithful Friar, he performs his duties at assembly meetings.

TRUSTEES - Together with the Faithful Navigator, Trustees serve as the Board of Trustees. The Board is responsible for auditing the record books of the Faithful Comptroller and Faithful Purser annually (June 30). Trustees shall perform other duties as directed by the assembly or assembly officers, District Master, or Vice Supreme Master.





